## ENCOMPASS DINER SUPPORTS LOCAL PEOPLE

As the days get colder, a charity in Barnstaple is offering a service to help people in need in the North Devon area. The Encompass Diner, which is held every Tuesday at the Parish Rooms, Church Lane is providing free hot drinks and toast from 8.30am and a free three course hot meal from 12pm for those that are looking for advice and support.

Claire Fisher, operations director for the charity said: "The Diner is an essential service in the area that supports people with a variety of needs. Our guests may need advice on finances, homelessness or simply may just want to speak with someone as they are feeling lonely and isolated. As the weather turns colder, we see that many people can't afford to heat their house all day and so a free hot meal in a warm building can be a real life line during the winter."

At the Diner, guests are provided with the opportunity to speak to a qualified advisor to gain advice and guidance on a range of issues such as housing, debt and benefits in an informal, but confidential setting. It provides a key link into to other services offered by Encompass Southwest. On average, the Diner feeds between 30-40 guests each week and welcomes an extra 40-50 people who drop in for a coffee and advice throughout the morning.

Encompass relies on donations and currently are in need of the following items.

flour, caster sugar, stock cubes, gravy granules, jelly, tinned fruit, tinned tomatoes, pepper, brown sauce, coffee, tea, instant hot chocolate, washing up liquid, baked beans, tinned tomatoes. Any other non perishable donations would be gratefully received and would be used in food parcels. Ideally tins would ring pulls would be helpful as those clients who are homeless don't have tin openers.

Thank you for your support, the donations we received really do make a difference.

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
